6th GRADE HEALTH ALERT

The State of New Jersey requires that all students entering 6th grade and born on or after January 1, 1997 receive one booster dose of the tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis (Tdap) vaccine and one dose of meningococcal vaccine. THIS IS REQUIRED FOR ALL STUDENTS WHETHER ATTENDING SCHOOL IN-PERSON OR REMOTELY (if the school moves to remote in the future). Documentation from your physician or clinic needs to be on file with Link's School Nurse by Tuesday, October 12, 2021 or your child will be excluded from school. Please make arrangements to have your child vaccinated. Please send the proof of immunization to the nurse.

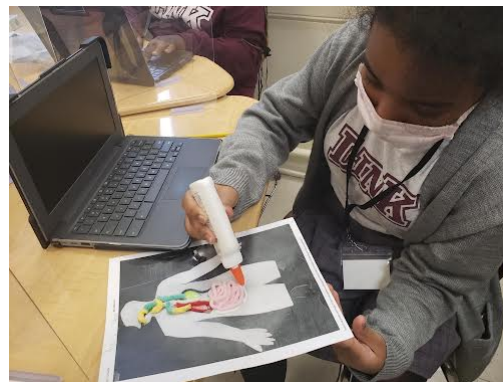
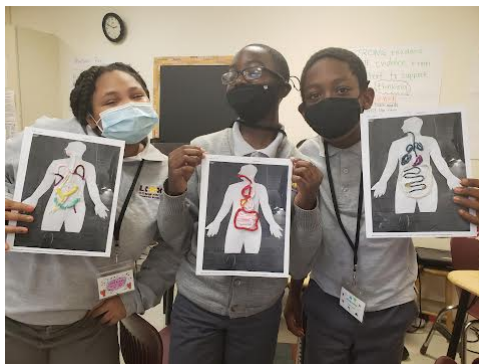
7TH GRADE SCIENTISTS LEARN TO CLASSIFY
