Facts:

Hispanic people are the largest minority in the United States. Only Mexico

has a larger Hispanic population than the United States.

In 2015, the Census Bureau projected that in 2060, Hispanic people will comprise 28.6% of the total population, with 119 million Hispanic individuals residing in the United States.

Purpose, Cont'd.

- There are an estimated <u>58.9 million Hispanic people in the United States</u>, comprising 18.1% of the population.
- An estimated 41 million US residents, or 13.4% of the population, speak
 Spanish at home.
- An estimated 22.5 million Spanish speakers also speak English "very well," according to the 2017 Census survey. An additional 6.8 million reported they speak English "well." Over 30% are bi-lingual.

Of the 58,846,134 Hispanic people in the United States, the following is a

breakdown of how they define their race:

- White alone: 38,222,255
- Some other race alone: 15,719,042
- Two or more races: 2,782,900
- Black alone: 1,263,898
- American Indian and Alaska Native alone: 581,116
- Asian alone: 215,482
- Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander alone: 61,441



Procedures

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
