Dear Ms. Daughtry:

On November 25, 2019, the New Jersey Department of Education (Department) received an amendment request from Link Community Charter School (LCCS) to expand the current grade configuration of grades five through eight in one of three ways. Two of LCCS' requests seek to include grades kindergarten through second and increase maximum enrollment from 312 students to 620 or 680 students by the end of the charter term 2023. The third request seeks to add grades kindergarten through three by the end of the charter term, 2023, while increasing enrollment to 720 students. This charter amendment was sought pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:11-2.6, which allows a charter school to submit to the Commissioner a request to amend its charter at any time during the charter term.

The Department has evaluated this request by reviewing LCCS' academic, operational, and fiscal standing based on the criteria outlined in the Office of Charter and Renaissance Schools' Performance Framework. The Department's evaluation also included a review of any public comment received in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:11-2.6(c), demand for an increase in LCCS' grade configuration and enrollment, and consideration of the fiscal impact on the region of residence. Based on the review outlined below, I am denying LCCS' amendment request.

Academic Performance

The Department utilizes the Academic section of the Performance Framework, which consists of three academic performance frameworks, to evaluate the relative success of the elementary, middle and high school programs offered by charter schools. Academic performance is assessed by tested grade span, with Grades 3-5 representing the elementary program, Grades 6-8 the middle school program and Grades 9-12 the high school program. Each academic performance framework consists of four categories of metrics: Student Growth (or Graduation Rate for high school programs), Achievement, Leading Indicators, and Closing Gaps. Each metric is worth a number of points, and the percent of total points earned determines the Tier Rank for each program. Tier Rank 1 programs are considered high performing, Tier Rank 2 middle performing, and Tier Rank 3 low performing. Following are the results for LCCS:

Note: "Sum" is short for "Summative Tier Rank" which is determined by calculating the percent of total points earned in each grade span, weighted by the percent of students enrolled in each tested grade span.

Preliminary analysis of 2018-2019 statewide assessment results suggest that LCCS continues to maintain consistent performance similar to 2017-2018. In a thorough analysis of results from the previous five years, LCCS has increased overall performance in both English Language Arts and mathematics. Also consistent across historical analysis is LCCS' grade band performance. In grade five, tested students consistently rank Tier 1, or the highest performance based on the Academic Performance Framework, while grades 6-8 consistently rank Tier 2, or middle performance based on the Academic Performance Framework.

Fiscal Performance

The Department relies on the financial section of the Performance Framework to assess financial viability based on measures of near-term financial health, longer term financial sustainability and fiscal-related compliance. The Department also considers the fiscal impact of the expansion on sending districts. Review of the fiscal standing of LCCS indicates that the school met standard on most rated measures in the Fiscal Performance Framework, Based on review, LCCS is fiscally sound; however, there are substantial concerns regarding the sustainability for the sending district of Newark. Through the Department's comprehensive review, the Department considers the fiscal impact on sending districts. Approximately 27,000 seats are currently allocated to charter schools who have identified Newark as a district of residence within their charter. I recognize that not all allocated seats will be filled by students who reside in Newark and LCCS claims a region of residence, however, according to the October 15, 2019 enrollment count, 17,567 students from Newark are attending a charter school. Considering the number of available charter seats already approved, Newark's obligation to charter enrollment suggests significant saturation. Additionally, while LCCS' request seeks to add grades kindergarten through two, considering the established grades it can be presumed that LCCS will seek an additional expansion at a later date to add grades that are not represented in the full configuration at the end of the charter term. If enrolling students using the current request of 100 students in a grade configuration of kindergarten through two or kindergarten through three by the end of the charter term, there would remain one or two grade levels not represented in a full kindergarten through eighth grade configuration with enrollment at 100 students per grade.

Organizational Performance

Similar to the academic and fiscal performance, the Department uses the Organizational section of the Performance Framework to review whether LCCS has demonstrated the organizational capacity to sustain the amendment request. LCCS' amendment request describes the current administrative capacity, performance management, and strategic plans for

expansion. While LCCS' long standing service has a strong record of organizational compliance, the fiscal impact on the district of residence causes considerable concern.

Public Comment and Demand

The Department received a letter of support for LCCS's expansion request and received no comment from any of the identified districts in LCCS's region of residence. The 2017 Annual Report for LCCS indicates a total of 88 students identified for LCCS' waitlist, while the 2018 Annual Report is incomplete. The 2019 Annual Report identifies 160 students on the waitlist with the highest grade being seventh at 74 students.

Dear Commissioner Repollet,

Thank you for responding to our request for amendment of the Link Community Charter School (LCCS) charter. As you are aware, we are pursuing school growth in order to begin the journey with our students during the critical foundational elementary school years. We have reviewed your response and appreciated your encouragement to submit a request pending changes to the fiscal impact on the district. We have identified a new plan that significantly reduces the fiscal impact from our initial enrollment plan options while continuing to support LCCS' goal to begin the Link educational journey in kindergarten. We are therefore pleased to submit this request for re-consideration.

I respectfully ask the Office of Charter and Renaissance Schools and the Commissioner of Education to consider the following revised enrollment plan for Link Community Charter School:

Link Community Charter School is currently approved to have 80 students in each grade level for a total school enrollment of 320 by school year 2021-2022. The new plan captured above seeks to gradually add grade levels with 50 students in each grade, while gradually reducing the size of the existing middle school grades. As the

previously submitted plans sought to maintain current grades at a minimum of 80 students each, the addition of Kindergarten to grade 4 necessitated a second facility. Grade sizes of 100 were necessary to maintain the second facility and meet the needs of all learners. By decreasing the middle school grade levels to 50 (over four years), LCCS can add the Kindergarten to 4th grade program in the current facility, providing a sustainable plan for growth for Link. This new plan was arrived at after very careful consideration of the school's mission, long term strategic goals and student need. Reducing the current middle school enrollment was frankly a difficult decision and was ultimately selected after consideration of various models.

With approval for this new plan, Link would ultimately have 50 students in each grade level, Kindergarten through 8th, for a total of 450 students at full K-8 enrollment. This would mean an additional 130 students over the course of four years as compared to our initial plan to add 500 students during the same time period.

In light of the financial impact on the District of Newark and concern around enrollment saturation, we have taken time to reevaluate growth in keeping with our primary objective to add an elementary school. Our revised enrollment plan addresses both areas raised in your response and mitigates any impact. While this request is specifically for growth up until LCCS' next renewal, given the concerns raised, we thought it prudent to look both to the short term (up to renewal) and the long term (at full enrollment) to determine such impact on Newark. Below is what we found.

Impact at full enrollment (130 additional students)

- At full expansion (SY2023-2024), we would have a total of 450 students, adding 130 seats to our approved max enrollment of 320.
- At most, the proposed full expansion of 130 seats (with the possibility of 100% coming from Newark) would amount to less than 0.5% of the 27,000 allocated charter seats in Newark. This is a negligible amount of growth with limited impact on charter enrollment overall. Even with all 130 additional students coming from Newark, the financial impact would be less than the first proposed plans and it would be gradual.
- The reality is that LCCS' enrollment is spread primarily over four (4) sending districts (Newark, Irvington, East Orange and Orange) so the impact on Newark (and each of the other districts) would be much lower. Using our current district allocation, we can project that the makeup of our additional seats would be as follows:

As the chart on the previous page demonstrates, the increase in enrollment for the District of Newark will be minimal, thus limiting the financial impact and saturation impact. The same is true for the other three sending districts.

Impact at renewal (110 additional students)

- At the time of LCCS's next renewal (SY2022-2023), we would have a total of 430 students, adding 110 seats above our current approved max of 320.
- Using our current residential ratio, under this new enrollment plan, approximately 170 students would come from Newark Public Schools, across multiple schools, at renewal in 2022-2023; this is an increase of 50 students from Newark Public Schools (NPS) over the current enrollment.
- In the first year of growth (2020-2021), approximately 151 students would come from Newark (only 31 more than our current enrollment).

As a mission driven school for 50 years, we are uniquely committed to placing students in competitive high schools. We work to prepare students for challenging and supportive high schools in and around Newark. Therefore, Link does not intend to continue growth into the high school level. We will continue to nurture students who will enter Newark's magnet high schools (approximately 25% of graduates annually) as we have for decades, and we welcome additional ways we can collaborate with the district.

We also wish to update some information in the Public Comment and Demand section of the response to our request. Please note that Link Community Charter School submitted letters of support from NJ Assemblyman Jamel Holley, Township of Orange Mayor Dwayne D. Warren, Newark School of the Arts, FarrEducation, and NJ Children's Foundation. We also received positive feedback from Orange Superintendent Gerald Fitzhugh, II and New Jersey Senator Teresa Ruiz during meetings with them. Finally, we shared a letter capturing a communication from Superintendent Roger Leon that he would not oppose Link's planned growth.

We understand and respect the financial position that the Newark Public Schools District is in and worked hard to find a plan that allows us both to grow and meet our school's goals, while supporting the District.

Essex County Addendum of Memorandum of Agreement between Education and Law Enforcement Officials – School Critical Incident Drills

Pursuant to the establishment by the Department of Law & Public Safety and the Department of Education in 1988 and encompassing the 1992, 1999 and 2007 revisions of the Uniform State Memorandum of Agreement between Education and Law Enforcement Officials (MOA) by the Attorney General and the Commissioner of Education, the following agreed upon addendum to the MOA is established by the Essex County Prosecutor's Office (ECPO) for use during critical incidents and critical incident drills occurring in Essex County Schools. Specifically, this addendum will address the need for joint critical incident drills involving municipal police departments in schools during drills and the use of a common vocabulary.

The purpose of the School Critical Incident Drills addendum to the Memorandum of Agreement is to ensure students, school personnel, others in the school or on school grounds and police are familiar with preliminary safety procedures in the event of a critical incident and can communicate clearly about those procedures. The objective of this addendum is to establish common vocabulary and promote collaboration and coordination during school security drills to increase preparedness in the event of a critical incident.

- a. School Drills Under terms of this MOA addendum, it is agreed that the Municipal Police Department will:
- 1. Participate in at least one (1) drill per building per year in each school building in the school district signatory to this MOA.
 - This joint drill will occur on a date and at a time determined jointly by the school district or administrator and the local chief of police and/or designee.
 - It is suggested that drill types (including, but not limited to reverse evacuation, shelter in place, lockdown, evacuation and room clear) are rotated from year to year to familiarize school personnel and police with appropriate procedures for each event type.
 - Police are responsible for contacting the local Fire Department and EMS to request and strongly encourage participation in the joint drill.
- 2. The joint drill will be followed by a **briefing** between public safety personnel and building administrators to gather suggestions for improvement by either the school or public safety officials. This briefing should include:
 - Review between those public safety officials present and school administrator of issues surrounding fire alarm activation and/or silencing during a lock down, shelter in place or other critical incident response that does not initiate with an actual fire;
 - Review of any recommendations regarding use and meaning of colored cards or other codes in exterior windows and classroom doors during specific drill types;
 - Review of any public safety response times and overview of tactical issues;
 - Review of any recommendations about whether window blinds should be up or down during specific drill types;
 - Review of whether rooms should be identified by number or other marker on exterior or interior windows and doors;
 - Review of communications plan in the event of an actual critical incident; and

- Any other issues deemed appropriate by school administrator or public safety officials.
- 3. The joint drill will be scheduled by the school administrator or district by February of each year. If the school attempts to schedule a joint drill with the police department and they do not participate or if the police department schedules and does not appear, the school will document its efforts. If the school has not scheduled a joint drill by February, the police department should attempt to do so and document all attempts to do so. Police departments shall **certify** to the ECPO each year by April 1st that a critical incident drill has occurred with police in the building in each school or the attempts to do so. A form provided by the ECPO will be used (see attached). This form will require a certification that the police department has conducted the briefing required in paragraph 2 above.
- 4. Under terms of this MOA addendum, it is agreed that Essex County Schools will:
 - 1. Conduct one (1) non-traditional drill per year. A non-traditional drill is a drill that is either
 - initiated by someone other than the building administrator or
 - occurs during non-classroom time such as morning entry, lunch period, school wide assembly or dismissal
 - it is suggested, but not required, that this drill take place with police in the building
 - it is suggested that drill types (lock out, shelter in place, lockdown, evacuation and room clear) for the non-traditional drill are rotated from year to year to familiarize school personnel and police with appropriate procedures for each event type.
- b. Each school district will report to the County Superintendent that each school building has conducted such a drill by June 30th of each year. An amended Joint Critical Incident Drill Record Form will be used for this purpose (see attached.) This form will require an indication that the police were present for at least one joint drill in each building per year (which can be the non-traditional drill or a traditional drill) or the schools' attempts to schedule with police.

c. Common Vocabulary

The purpose of the Common Vocabulary addendum to the Memorandum of Agreement is to ensure that standardized language is used to limit communications-related misunderstandings and uncertainties during critical incidents. Education and Law Enforcement Officials are expected to use the following common vocabulary:

Term for Common Responses	Short Definition	Minimum Expected Action
Reverse Evacuation	Recovers all persons from outside of the building and secures the building perimeter.	- Lock interior doors - Instruction my continue - Students may change class
Shelter in Place	Recovers all persons from outside of the building if safe to do so. If not safe to do so, all persons seek alternate shelter site. All persons in classrooms, instructional, or other safe areas of school building remain there. No movement in hallways or other common areas including the changing of classes.	- Lock exterior doors - Lock interior doors - Instruction may or may not continue (listen for instructions)
Lockdown	Recovers all persons to an area behind a locked door, where all persons seek cover in an area of room less visible from hallway. All individuals remain behind locked door until instructed by school administration or law enforcement. For persons outside the building, seek alternate shelter site.	 Lock exterior doors Check hallways and usher any students into classroom If feasible, check bathrooms for students and usher into classroom Lock interior doors, turn off lights and all electronics Seek cover (Hide)
Evacuation	Students, staff and other occupants are directed to evacuate to a specific area outside of the building.	
Room Clear	Directs the occupants of a specific classroom or area to immediately leave the room or area and relocate to another location under the care of a staff member or emergency personnel.	
Designated School Entrance/Exit	The school entrance/exit designated by the School Officer in Charge and/or the location that will be monitored during a security protocol event.	

While codes (such as, for example, "Code Red" or "Mr. Major") should **not** be used to initiate a drill or critical incident response, it is within the discretion of school districts to establish codes to **conclude** a drill or incident to minimize unintended or premature releases from a safety procedure.
