COVID IS ON THE RISE...AGAIN...HERE'S HOW WE CAN KEEP OUR COMMUNITY SAFE

 If your child tests positive for COVID, please make sure they stay home and ISOLATE from others for at least 5 full days (day one is the first day of symptoms or if no symptoms, the day the test is administered)

- If at the end of the 5 full days of isolation, symptoms have improved and your child has been fever free for at least 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication, your child can return to school with a mask for days 6 through 10.
- If at the end of the 5 full days of isolation, symptoms are not improving and your child continues to experience a fever, continue to isolate until fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication and other symptoms improve.
- Children with more severe symptoms or a weakened immune system should contact their doctor for more guidance and may need to isolate for a longer period of time.

Scholars, staff, and visitors may wear masks if they wish and masks are available at the entrances of the school.

Beyond COVID, if your child experiences a fever, please don't send your child to school until free free for at least 24 hours WITHOUT fever reducing medication.

WEEK OF RESPECT

The first week of October has been designated as The Week of Respect by the New Jersey State Legislature due to the tragic events that have taken place in far too many youths' lives regarding bullying experiences. During the week of October 2 -6, our middle school students will be involved in discussions in Morning Circle and Advisory that focus on respect, prevention of bullying, and ways to build our community in positive and caring ways. Please speak with your child about respect and caring for others this week to reinforce what they will hear in school.

THINK PINK AT LINK

For a donation of \$2, students may dress in PINK to observe National Breast Cancer Awareness month on Friday, October 13, 2023. They may wear SOLID PINK tee shirts or other shirt, top, or blouse with sleeves, but NOT crop tops or other tops with torso showing, even if a shirt is worn underneath or hooded sweatshirts. They may wear slacks or pants of their choice but NO RIPPED JEANS, NO LEGGINGS OR JEGGINGS, AND NO SHORTS. They may not wear sandals, crocs,

or backless shoes. If students choose not to participate, they are to wear their Link uniform. The donations will go to the American Cancer Society. Students should bring in their donations in an envelope with their name on it and give it to their advisor. REPORTING STUDENT ABSENCE

If your child will be absent for any reason, you must contact Ms. Brooks at 973.642.0529 or send an email to <u>absent@linkschool.org</u> by 8:30 am on the morning of the absence. <u>Absences count as excused only if Link has parent notification.</u>

Also, please note that, for an absence to be excused you need to do the following:

• if your child is out for illness for 1-2 days, call/email the school each day

• **if your child is out three or more days**, you must notify the school as above and your child needs to present a doctor's note to the office upon return to school.

If your child will be out for an extended period and you would like to obtain your child's classwork for them to complete while home, send an email to <u>gradelevelleaders@linkschool.org</u> and someone will get back to you in 24 hours.

CLARIFICATION ON LINK UNIFORM

Grey Slacks – Your child may wear grey slacks that are not purchased from Flynn O'Hara if they:

- Are charcoal grey in color,
- Are slacks in make and fabric (no jeans/denims, leggings/jeggings, cargo pants, sweatpants)
- Are not tight fitting
- Have belt loops with which your student must wear a plain black belt.

Students receive demerits for inappropriate uniforms and parents will be called if their student is dressed incorrectly.

Also, "mixing and matching" garments from the regular and gym uniform is not allowed. For example, no grey sweaters with gym uniforms; no polo shirts with gym uniforms; no tee shirts with regular uniforms, etc.

USED LINK UNIFORMS

Please consider donating gently used Link uniforms back to the school so they can be shared with other families. Similarly, if you need a particular garment, please let us know at <u>uniformrequest@linkschool.org</u> and we will see if there is a used one for you. Note: most of our stock right now consists of sweaters and sweatshirts. But we hope in time to have a larger selection that can help our families with the expense of the uniform.

HOMEWORK

Homework reinforces and extends the learning that takes place in the classroom. Parents will begin to see students coming home with homework that they are required to do. You can help by providing a quiet place for your child to concentrate on lessons and encouragement so they complete their homework in a quality way and in a timely manner.

- Students in grades 7 and 8 will generally have assignments in 2 core subjects on two nights per week and then in two other core subject areas on the other two nights. On Fridays and weekends, students are expected to read for pleasure and/or complete IXL (online math program.)
- Student in grades 5 and 6 will generally have assignments in 1 core subject each evening (4 evenings.) On Fridays and weekends, students are expected to read for pleasure and/ or complete IXL (online math program.)
- Students in kindergarten through grade 2 may receive daily assignments, but generally not weekend work. Also they are expected to read each evening.





HIGH SCHOOL HAPPENINGS

The High School Placement process is in full swing for our 8th grade students and families! If you have not yet scheduled your High School Placement (HSP) Conference with Mr. Silver, please be sure to contact him at gsilver@linkschool.org. During the conference, families will learn about all the exemplary high school options, application steps, entrance exam details, financial aid/scholarship information, and much more! The conference can be conducted in person in Mr. Silver's office (classroom, or via Zoom, whichever works best for the conference).
