LINK CHROMEBOOK DISTRIBUTION

Link provides each student with an individual Chromebook to be used at school for school work. Distribution is beginning now, one grade level at a time.

Chromebooks are an essential component of our instructional program and a wonderful tool for learning. These Chromebooks are the property of Link Community Charter School and scholars must handle them with care and meet all Core Values and technology expectations in using them. Please note each student



is responsible for paying a technology fee of \$25.00 for the 2023-24 school year and for reading and signing the Acceptable Use Form.

A little later in the fall, we will make Chromebooks available for home use to those families who would like to have them as a tool for homework and independent learning. Anyone receiving a Link Chromebook for home use will be required to pay an additional technology fee of \$25.00.

The use of any Link technology, whether in or outside the school building, both Chromebook and the school's email platform, are subject to disciplinary action pursuant to Link's Disciplinary Rubric. Additionally, any online activity outside the school building that impacts the school environment will also be subject to the rubric. Any willful misuse, destruction, or misplacement of a Link Chromebook or other technology tools may lead to additional consequences.

Link provides the tools for your child's success. We encourage you to discuss the importance of maintaining the Chromebook in excellent condition and using it for the right purposes with your child.

BUYER BEWARE: UNOFFICIAL LINK UNIFORMS

We understand that some parents have purchased from a <u>vendor who is not offering the correct Link uniform</u>. The official Link uniform is sold only through Flynn O'Hara and Link expects your child to wear that uniform. Garments that are not included in the dress code that we have seen from the unauthorized vendor such as magenta sweaters, vests, plaid skirts, etc. are not acceptable. Health and Wellness Corner

NATIONAL SUICIDE PREVENTION MONTH

September is Suicide Prevention Month — a time to raise awareness and discuss this highly stigmatized topic. In addition to shifting public perception, we use this month to spread hope and vital information to people affected by suicide. Our goal is ensuring that individuals, friends, and families have access to the resources they need to discuss suicide prevention and to seek help.

Youth and young adults between the ages of 10-24 account for 15% of all suicides. However, suicide is the second leading cause of death for this age group.

If you know someone who is at immediate risk of suicide, call 911 right away. It can be difficult when someone you know expresses thoughts about suicide, but you can show support by doing the following:

- **Talk.** Your willingness to express your concern for the person in crisis can be the first step in getting that person help.
- Listen. Being an active listener is another way of reminding a person in crisis that they are not alone.
- **Remain Present.** Your physical and emotional presence in the person's life makes a difference. If you are worried about their safety, get help from a mental health professional immediately.
- Call or text 988. Last year, 988 was activated as a new three-digit dialing code. When someone dials 988, they will be connected to the existing National Suicide Prevention Lifeline. This confidential support line is available 24 hours a day to provide free help to people in suicidal crisis or mental health-related distress.
- 2NDFLOOR is a confidential and anonymous helpline for New Jersey's youth and young adults. They are there to help youth and young adults find solutions to the problems that they face at home, at school or at play. 2NDFLOOR is available 24/7. You can call or text 888-222-2228.

The High School Placement process is in full swing for our 8th grade students and families! If you have not yet scheduled your High School Placement (HSP) Conference with Mr. Silver, please be sure to contact him at silver@linkschool.org. During the conference, families will learn about all the exemplary high school options, application steps, entrance exam details, financial aid/scholarship information, and much

more! The conference can be conducted in-person in Mr. Silver's office/classroom, or via Zoom, whichever works best for the families. The conference typically lasts 30-45 minutes.

In the meantime, it is important that students and parents/guardians begin to learn more about some of the high schools to which students might be applying! The best way to learn about specific high school academic programs, extra-curricular opportunities, (arts, athletics, leadership programs), admissions procedures, and overall school culture is to VISIT HIGH SCHOOLS THIS FALL! Many schools offer Open House programs in the evenings and/or on weekends. See below for some links to various high schools' open house schedules and other prospective new family events. Don't forget to RSVP/register for any open house events that you plan to attend, as many programs fill to capacity weeks before the event takes place.
