### IMPORTANT CHROMEBOOK ANNOUNCEMENT

Please speak with your child about:



(1) keeping track of their Chromebook at school at all times. If a student misplaces their Chromebook, valuable instructional time – for the student and sometimes an entire class - is lost in tracking it down and/or finding a temporary replacement. Demerits are issued each time a student misplaces a Chromebook. Multiple infractions could

result in stronger disciplinary consequences. Also, if a student is unable to locate their Chromebook within three days, the parents will be assessed a replacement fee of \$150. \* Parents will be called on the first day the device is found to be missing.

(2) making certain your child treats their Chromebook as an essential tool for learning. We have seen an increase in the number of damaged devices recently. Please note that if a Chromebook is intentionally damaged or if a student has been negligent about caring for the device, the student will receive disciplinary consequences, including exclusion from special events and activities, and the parents will be assessed a replacement fee of <u>\$150.\*</u>

\*The \$25 technology fee assessed to each family covers the warranty for the device. The warranty does not cover intentional damage or negligence.

# 5<sup>TH</sup> GRADE HEALTH ALERT: IMMUNIZATIONS DUE SEPTEMBER 1, 2024

The State of New Jersey requires that all students entering 6th grade and born on or after January 1, 1997 receive one booster dose of the tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis (Tdap) vaccine and one dose of meningococcal vaccine. Documentation from your physician or clinic needs to be on file with Link's School Nurse by the first day of school in September 2024 or your child may be excluded from school. We encourage you to make an

appointment for your child to have this immunization well before the start of school in the fall so your child will not be excluded from attending. Send the proof of immunization to the nurse. (There is a form on the parent page of the school website that you can download and take to the doctor.) # LINK GOES RED ON FEBRUARY 14<sup>TH</sup>

Link students and staff are invited to wear RED on Tuesday to celebrate Valentine's Day. We're letting you know ahead of time so you and your child can plan a red outfit, if desired. <u>The student must wear a garment that is very obviously red!</u> As a refresher, students are required to follow the school's policy on attire for Dress Down Days including:

- No torn or ripped jeans/pants/shorts of any kind; no leggings
- Shorts and skirts must be fingertip length
- Shirts and blouses must have sleeves. (No spaghetti straps, tube tops, tank tops, crop tops, etc.)
- Heels on shoes may be no higher than 1.5 inches. No flip flops, and all shoes must have a back or a back strap.
- No headgear no hoodies, hats, or bandanas. (Unless, of course, for religious purposes.) No sunglasses.
- No clothing that is revealing (too short, cut out, etc.) or too tight
- No garments that have writing or images that are inflammatory, hateful, or in violation of the Core Values or otherwise inappropriate.
- No garments that denote gang affiliations or is inappropriate for a school setting.

Students are not required to participate on Out of Uniform Days. If they are not interested or do not have the specific attire required, students are to wear the school uniform.


