Responding to your feedback

We appreciate the feedback and would like to share some updates and responses in this issue of the newsletter and will follow up over the next few weeks' issues with more.

- 1. **Direct Access to Teachers**. A couple parents stated they would like direct access to their child's. **Response**: Our teachers' primary responsibility during the school day is to instruct and tend to the needs of our students. We cannot call them out of class for phone calls. (Teachers in K-2 who are outside in the morning are willing to speak with parents briefly.) Instead, we ask you to email your child's teachers anytime to ask for information, express a concern, or set an appointment to meet. (Email addresses are on the Staff page of the shool website.) Teachers are required to respond within 24 hours (school days only). If you wish to speak with a teacher, please leave a message on the school's phone line 973.642.0529. Ms. Brooks will pass the message along, and the teacher will call you during a preparation period, again within 24 hours. If a teacher does not respond, please inform Mrs. Kennedy at <a href="https://linkschool.org">https://linkschool.org</a>.
- 2. How merits/demerits are distributed in the middle school grades. Some parents wanted to know why students receive more than one merit or demerit for a single action.
  Response: Students receive merits and demerits throughout the day, reinforcing positive behavior and addressing challenges. All Link staff members can issue merits and demerits, ensuring a fair and comprehensive approach. It's important to note that demerits are not issued to an entire team; instead are issued to specific students, thereby emphasizing individual accountability. Students may, in fact, receive more than 1 merit or demerit, as different behaviors (positive or negative) carry different point values. Students' scores on DeansList, influenced by merits and demerits, may impact participation in extracurricular events and clubs. We encourage the students to maintain 80% positive points, demonstrating that they are actively taking steps to earn merits in their classes. This connection underscores our commitment to character development and responsible citizenship. 
