ENROLLING YOUR YOUNGER CHILDREN AT LINK FOR 2024-2025 SCHOOL YEAR

The Newark Common App lottery, which Link participates in, will hold their lottery on March 11th. If your child has younger siblings that you would like to enroll at Link next year, apply through Link's website or the Newark Common App site by the 11th. <u>Siblings</u> receive priority, but you still need to apply. <u>Select Link as your top choice.</u> (Link does not

accept applications directly or in person since we're part of the Newark Common App program.) Do it now if you haven't already!

HELP LINK RECRUITMENT STUDENTS FOR '24-25

Please spread the word about Link to your friends and families and urge them to apply before March 11. They can do so through the Link website, which connects them to the Newark Common App site. We seek students in all grades, especially kindergarten, first, and fifth. To enter kindergarten, children must be five years old before October 1.

Note: Link has a referral program. If you refer a family to Link and the child enrolls and remains at the school, in October, you will receive the choice of a \$30 cash card or gift card to Flynn O'Hara. BLACK HISTORY MONTH CELEBRATIONS!

Students at all grade levels participated in extraordinary showcase events at the end of Black History Month. Each of the Lower House (kindergarten, grade 1, and grade 2) presented to their parents and the 5th and 6th graders. The highlight of the kindergarten program was their recitation of "The ABCs of Black History." The first grade, Teams Bridges and King focused their program on the two heroes, Ruby Bridges and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., after whom their teams were named. They recited poems and performed plays about each person. Students in both programs sang "What a Wonderful World" (by B. Thiel and G. Weiss) as Louis Armstrong originally recorded it. Second graders created a "Black History Wax Museum" for their presentation. Each student researched a famous Black changemaker or leader, prepared a speech, and came to the event dressed as the person they represented. Guests circulated through the gym, stopping at each "famous person's" station where they could request a recitation on who the student represented. In "attendance" were Ruby Bridges, Rosa Parks, Kobe Bryant, Mae Jemison, Jackie Robinson, James Brown, Frederick Douglas, and many others.

The last event was a play written by Link's performing arts teacher, Mrs. Sahirah Johnson, featuring the Link Players. Interspersed throughout the play were performances by students from all grade levels and staff, as well as Team Lewis, the Link Panther Cheerleaders, the Link Choir, and many more. One of Mrs. Johnson's students passed a petition amongst students to charge admission at the door, with the money going to a local non-profit that supports children and youth. School administration agreed, and the proceeds will go to Big Brothers Big Sisters, an organization that provides one-on-one mentoring to young people.
