



END OF YEAR PARENT SURVEY 2024: SUMMARY OF RESULTS

Disclaimers:

- When reviewing responses, only those relevant to the topic or question asked were considered when compiling the survey results.
- Where less than 36 responses were recorded, the number has been noted.

Who responded:

- 36 responses from 35 families. (One family completed separate surveys for each of their children.)
- 33% of the respondents have children at the Halsey Campus
- 70% of the respondents have students in the Upper House (5-8)
- 30% of respondents have students in the Lower House (K-2)

How satisfied are you with LCCS meeting your child's academic needs?

- 94% of the respondents indicated they are satisfied or better that LCCS is meeting their child's academic needs.

I have seen academic growth in my child this year.

- 89% of the respondents have seen growth (64% have seen great growth)

Feel free to provide examples of academic growth you have seen in your child. For example, homework improvement, increase in reading skills, stronger grades on progress reports or report cards, improved attitude about school, etc. (29 responses)

- 7 responded that their child's grades have improved.
- 8 responded that they improvement in skills, e.g. reading, math
- 2 responded that they are seeing homework improvement
- 8 responded that they have observed improved skills, in math, ELA, or both.
- 1 responded that they have seen no growth in math
- 3 responded everything was good

How satisfied are you with LCCS supporting your child's social and emotional learning?

- 95% of the respondents are satisfied or better (64% are highly satisfied)

I have seen social and emotional growth in my child.

- 95% of the respondents agree or better (56% strongly agree)

How satisfied are you with LCC's overall school environment?

- 97% of the respondents are satisfied or better (59% are highly satisfied)

Please rate your overall satisfaction with the school's discipline response and its effectiveness in maintaining a positive learning environment for your child.

- 94% of the respondents are satisfied or better (53% are highly satisfied)

How would you describe your level of communication with the school regarding discipline-related matters? Please share any specific instances or feedback on the school's responsiveness in addressing your concerns or inquiries.

- 25 responded that communication regarding discipline a good or excellent. A couple indicated that when their child had an issue, they were told immediately, and it was handled well. Some related that their children had not had a discipline issue but that their expectation was that the school would communicate with them if there was one.
- 7 responded they could not respond as their children weren't involved in disciplinary issues
- 4 respondents had concern regarding communications on discipline:
 - 2 were unhappy with the outcome of disciplinary action (not the communication)
 - 1 mentioned communication needed improvement, but was not specific
 - 1 mentioned not understanding the discipline system

In your opinion, what improvements or additional measures could the school implement to enhance its disciplinary approach and ensure a safer and more supportive environment for students? Please provide specific suggestions or examples.

- 14 respondents say there are no new measures needed
- Here are some of the measure/issues that individual parents think need improvement (mentioned once unless otherwise noted):
 - Contact parents immediately when something happens.
 - School is overly strict
 - Expel student if behavior does not improve
 - Don't punish the whole class for the infractions a one or a few students
 - Listen better
 - Encourage students to do better
 - Search backpacks and bags before classes begin
 - Not every discipline issue needs a demerit
 - Address bullying
 - Involve social workers
 - More interaction
 - Too much loitering at the corner store before and after school

I am satisfied with safety and security at my child's campus.

- 97.5% of respondents are satisfied or better

In order to help us continually evaluate and plan, please provide specific examples of the areas you are satisfied with.

- 8 responded they were satisfied or had no suggestions
- Respondents mentioned the following as areas of the school with which they were satisfied:
 - Class size
 - Communications (3)
 - Teachers (3)
 - Academic and social aspects (4)
 - Security (4)
 - Classrooms (light, space, learning materials)
 - Coordination of dismissal
 - Recognition of students
 - Class engagement strategies and activities
 - Willingness to help students

In order to help us continually evaluate and plan, please provide specific examples of one or two areas you would like to see us improve.

- 7 respondents had no suggestions
- Respondents mentioned the following areas for improvement:
 - Aftercare
 - Fair discipline
 - consistent and reliable teachers (3)
 - Secure place for the cell phones
 - Answer the office phone in a timelier manner
 - Outdoor playtime
 - Lunch
 - Hall lights are dim
 - More classes like cooking and sewing
 - Closer look at bullying
 - Vaping in the bathrooms
 - More sports and clubs (2)
 - Less strict recess
 - After school tutoring
